#### Safety:

Mike Reddrick was trying to pull up his stretchy nylon string line which was attached to his fence with nails. The line was cutting into his hands, so he wrapped it around his belt buckle and pulled it with his body. At the last minute, fearing the nail would hit him, he covered his head. The nail went into his rear and he had to get a tetanus shot. Remember to C.Y.A.

#### **Problems and Solutions:**

How do you make a curved board flat? Use a joiner and planer.

Knock down the corners with a scrub plane and use light passes on a planer with the cupped side down. Or use it for firewood.

How do you paint a sign made from treated lumber?

Use ultra wood which is dried after treating or #1 kiln dried from Stahlman Lumber. Use latex paint or epoxy base paint for a longer life.

What do you need to do to keep from burning motors?

Use a circuit breaker or fuse box rated for your motor. Check for proper line size. The National Electrical Code is available at the library. Consult an electrician.

#### **Charity Project:**

The charity project got underway on Saturday, January 18, and on Monday, January 20, at Jimmie and Brian's shop. The benches and tables were made Saturday and on Monday we started on the swings. The following people were there: David Cobb, Bill Rhea, Reese White, Marcus Brun, David Rinn, Steve Proctor, Lee Palfreyman, Guy Meaders, Bruce Braunstein, Jimmie Harp, Mike Reddrick, and Bob Gilbertson. The Splinter Group decided to meet the next two Mondays to finish the swings.

#### January Program:

The January program was a three part program.

The first part was Steve Proctor showing how he makes drawers on a production basis. He had samples of drawers that he had made and he explained how to make them, step by step. He uses 1/2" material for sides and 1/4" material for the bottom. First he cut resides, ends, and bottoms to the correct width and length. Then he sets his dado head to cut the dados for the bottom and the lock joints for the sides on the same setting. He prefinishes the parts before assembly. Then he assembled the drawer. It was a perfect fit.

The second part of the program was Brian Owens showing how he makes cabinets using face frame construction. Brian precut all the pieces for his cabinets and he explained how he did it. He uses a Jointmatic to cut his tenons, and a Delta mortising machine to cut his mortises. The rest of the cutting is done on the table saw. With the help of Jimmie Harp, he assembled the face frame and the cabinet giving instructions as he went. When he finished he had a very fine cabinet for his daughter.

Mike Turner was supposed to show us how he makes pole lamps. Mike was ready to go but we ran out of time. Steve and Brian also had to rush their programs because of time restraints.

It was really interesting to see how the pros do it.

It's so fast and so eeeeeeesy.

#### Show & Tell:

David Cobb had his workbench made from some very dense and hard wood. The wood was donated and has yet to be identified. It has beautiful color and grain. If you know what it is, give him a call.

Bob Gilbertson had his workbench made from maple, and a bowl made from spaulted magnolia. The Northwest Splinter Group did most of the work on this bench.

Chuck Maxwell made a CD storage case from plans in Woodsmith #105. Chuck made his to hold 80 CD's. He also brought the jigs to make the case.

Bill Rhea made a mantel clock from plans in Woodsmith #108. It was made from tiger maple and finished with aniline dye and polyurethane. He also brought his Jewelry Cabinet made from plans in Woodsmith #106. It was made from walnut and finished with tung oil. Beautiful workmanship!

Boyce Gahagan brought a variety of pocket watches and plumb bobs made from exotic woods. finishes with Hut wax and a buffer. Excellent pieces!


