MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Hearing Protection in the Shop

I consider myself a safety-oriented woodworker. In my years as a hobbyist woodworker, I have managed to avoid any significant injuries. One area where I am trying to improve my game is hearing protection, but I haven't found the perfect solution just yet. Like many woodworkers, I tried the foam ear plugs. The plugs are cheap and effective, but putting them in, taking them out, putting them back in, etc. gets to be a pain after a while. Not to mention trying to remember where you left them, and then finding them on the floor, with a light coat of sawdust.

My next try was a set of over-the-ear muffs. The muffs work well and are easy to put on/take off. However, they get hot and crush my eyeglass frames into my head after long periods. And I can't wear the muffs and my Peke Safety Cap which provides both eye and lung protection.

My third iteration was noise isolating earbuds with blue tooth capability. This seemed really promising, hearing protection while adding in music or a podcast when working. The reality is less promising. The earbuds are harder to insert than foam earplugs as you have to manage the cord while trying to get a proper fit to maximize noise reduction. The noise reduction isn't as good as I hoped. I tried wearing both the earbuds and the muffs to get better noise reduction while retaining the music, but the problems with the muffs made that solution impractical.

My current test case is wireless earbuds with active noise cancellation. This sounded like a sure-fire winner, good sound quality, noise cancellation, wireless, and integration with my phone. The jury is still out on this option. The earbuds are much easier to put in/take out, the sound quality is very good, but the noise cancellation isn't as dramatic as I was hoping.



Hugh Parker


Member Since 2003ish
