MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Starting with a "heads up", our normal meeting date of the second Saturday on the month falls on Easter weekend in April. Bayland Community Center is closed that weekend, so we have moved the Club meeting to the third Saturday, April 21. We will communicate this change often in the coming weeks, but put the new date on your calendar!

To those that missed the January meeting, we handed out three awards, the Golden Hammer to David Janowitz in recognition of his service to the Club over the past year. The Woodworker of the Year went to David VanDewerker for his amazing scroll saw projects every month! And an award that hasn't been given out in quite some time, the Lifetime Achievement Award, went to Steve Procter for his many years of service to the Club (Club President twice, separated by 27 years is the tip of the iceberg). Congratulations to all the recipients for awards well-deserved.

As you may have seen from my Show-n-Tell presentations, I have been working my way through David Wakefield's "Animated Animal Toys in Wood" project book, building toys for my grandsons. I tend to be a strict "follow the instructions" type of woodworker, assuming that the author has worked through all of the issues in constructing the project. And to quote Brian Fantana from the movie Anchorman, "Sixty percent of the time it works every time!"

The "Gallivanting Gorilla" toy uses offset wheels on the front axle to impart a wobble action meant to imitate a gorilla's natural movement. The plans called for a ¼" offset in each direction, resulting in a ½" total offset. For such a small toy, that seemed like quite a bit, but who was I to question? The results were a toy that simply could not roll! See the picture below for how far the back wheel raises up when the gorilla tries to roll. (Cont. on Page 2)

I built the front axle assembly twice thinking I must have done something wrong!

Doing a little research on similar toys both in the book and elsewhere, none had an offset of that amount. So in building the front axle for a third time, I used a 1/8" offset in each direction. The result was a smooth-running toy with plenty of gorilla-like swagger.

The moral of the story is that mistakes and misprints can happen in the best of plans. A good woodworker should think through the steps and details as presented, while keeping a skeptical eye out for things that don't seem to make sense. You just might save yourself a lot of time and frustration!
