NOVEMBER MEETING

Our guest speaker was Rodney Hill of College Station. Rodney Hill had some spectacular examples of his and his wifes' work. Rodney does this in his spare time as he is a full time Professor at the Design school of Architecture at Texas A & M.

After watching this amazing array of work on slides, one member deemed that Rodney could be no younger than 89 years old.

He became a carver by necessity. When he was designing for an architectural firm, he created a stair with the stair treads carved in the Art Nouveau style. The customer loved the design and the boss told Rodney he had a

new project to occupy his spare time.

Rodney brought along some examples of his design students work and the creativity was very interesting. Some of the designs were a wooden working telephone, sharks to alligators, desk lamps shaped like a hand. His students worked on the design and carving of telephone poles for a playground at the River Oaks Baptist Church, this is the largest playground in

His main choice of wood seemed to be Walnut and some of the native Texas woods like Pecan.

80 % of his carvings are hand carved, he uses power carving only for under cutting.
He does a lot of work for churches: some

examples: for the Highland Park Baptist Church he did five carved screens from the bible, he's working on a study of crosses, in Pecan for a New Catholic Church in College station, A Crown

of Thorns For an Episcopal Church.

The Texas A & M commisioned he and his wife to do a 100 year history of the school carved in 6 panels 3 foot by 6 foot. It first took him four months of research to make up a composite of the history of the school. Some of the members have seen the panels on display at the school, they are also included in one of the Fine Woodworking Design books. one of the Fine Woodworking Design books.

On the outside of a 4-0 x 8-0 foot coffee table he carved book matched mammals, the coffee table has hidden drawers for books and to open you pull on Antiers or Rams Horns.

In the Texas room in Constitution Hall in

Washington D.C. the Hills have carved a Texas symbol 39" in diameter by 5 1/2" thick. In a Winery in Oklahoma City, the owners commisoned the Hill's to carve a Bacchus, the god of wine in classical mythology, because some groups touring the winery might be offended he had to include carved grape leaves, that could be attached or removed depending on the tour of the day. depending on the tour of the day.

One of his Architect friends said he had a most unusual request from a client and would he meet with her. and Tool.


We appreciate all the businesses that have allowed to hold our meeting at their places of business and for all the guest speakers, its been another successfull year for the club.


