yourself before you ever start.

Before you run to the shop and start cutting--You should figure out what type of joints that will affect the different lengths.

Remember its better to measure twice and cut once---or you might be making a lot of trips to the lumber yard.

Whether you use a computer or pencil and paper--Planning is one of the most important aspects of Woodworking.




